We do not use the short form in positive answers.

Example A Are you a doctor?

B Yes, I am. (not 'Yes, I'm.')

We can make short negatives in two different ways for you, he/she/it, they, and we:

You're not. / You aren't. We're not. / We aren't. He's not. / He isn't. They're not. / They aren't.

We use be to ask and answer about names, jobs, and ages.

Examples A Are you Adriana Gilberto? B Yes, I am.

A Are you teachers? B Yes, we are.
A Is he 45? B Yes, he is.

We use be + from to ask and answer about cities or countries.

Example A Is she from New York? B No, she isn't.

We use be to ask and answer if someone is married.

Example A Are they married? B No, they're not.

Short and long negative forms

We use the short negative forms when we speak.

Example I'm not from Spain.

We use the long negative forms when we write.

Example He is not a doctor.




